Never, ever let your spiritual guard down because the enemy is always looking for his shot. So remember to:

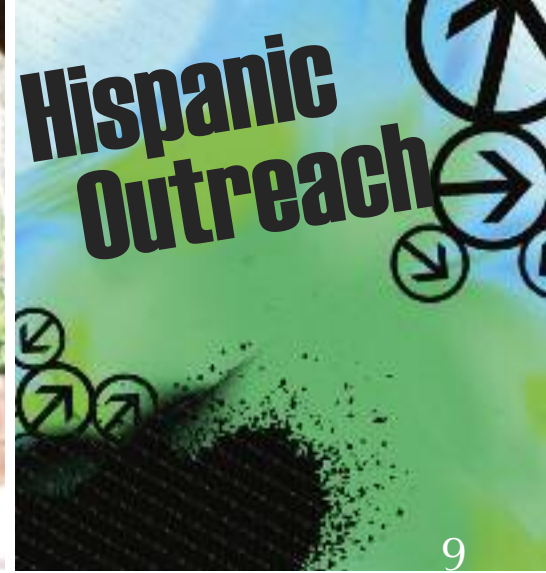
- Spend some time in the Word every morning before you get busy.

TECH TRENDS

>> QR Codes

So you might have seen a barcode similar to the one on this page on many new products and wondered: "What is this and what do I do with it?" This is the feeling most people have if they are not familiar with the new technology behind QR Codes. These little boxes full of dots and lines are a new way of offering consumers more information about a specific product by simply scanning the code with a smart phone camera. Many companies as well as individuals are taking advantage of this technology since QR Codes can store up to 4,296 alphanumeric characters of arbitrary text. This text can be anything; for example a web address or URL, contact information or vCards, telephone number, even a love letter! Scanning these with your smart phone camera can even help you connect to a wireless network or open a web page in the phone's browser. Although these QR Codes were originally used for tracking parts in vehicle manufacturing, today they are mostly used for convenience-oriented applications intended for smart phone users. You can also generate and print your own QR code for others to scan and use by visiting one of several free QR Code generating sites.

In order to scan a QR Code and obtain the information, you will need any smart phone—such as an iPhone, Android or Blackberry—with a built-in camera. You would then need to download a QR Code reader application. Many of them are free and can easily be found by searching QR reader at your APP store. Finally, open your QR Scanner App, aim the camera at the QR Code and scan. It's that simple! Now, try scanning the QR Code on this page and enjoy a digital version of this magazine. The Devastating Earthquakes in JAPAN

FORESHADOW THE FUTURE

What seismologists call a great earthquake, one of 9.0 magnitude on the Richter Scale, has hit the coastline of Japan causing a catastrophic tsunami in Japan and affecting more than 20 Pacific Rim nations bringing about much death and destruction. The initial earthquake, felt as far away from the epicenter of the quake as Beijing, China, brought with it a tsunami with waves over 20 feet high and traveling at around 500 miles per hour which is a natural disaster and in the early stages hitting the coast of Japan with no advanced warning.

Following the quake, the world watched as Japan struggled with food and water shortages, a failing nuclear reactor power plant in Fukushima, and many powerful aftershocks, including several over 7.0 on the Richter Scale. The death toll has reached well over 12,000 people, with many thousands still missing weeks after the disaster. Aid has come in from all over the world, rescue workers, food, fresh water, medical supplies, but it will take years to rebuild from the destruction.

Predicting the Next Quake

TEL AVIV - Professor Shmuel Marco of Tel Aviv University in Israel has created a new tool to help understand the patterns of ancient earthquakes, a tool called the fossil seismograph, that will help engineers understand what is at risk when they plan new hydroelectric power plants. This seismograph will provide an essential bit of information and wisdom given the tragic events in Japan. The fossil seismograph will be relevant to areas where earthquakes affect bodies of water like the west coast of the United States.

Jimmy's Prophetic Prospective on Earthquakes

The latest series earthquake off the coast of Japan not only caused mass destruction and death but it is a tangible evidence that we are coming close to the End Times scenario that can be found in Bible prophecy. Reports are still coming in and will continue to do so revealing the amount of death and destruction that has happened as a result of the massive earthquake and the tsunami that followed originating just off the coast of Japan. People along the coastline of Japan and in fact the more than 20 nations effected by the tsunami, these people have been eyewitness to what can happen in a matter of hours and in fact in some places a matter of minutes, a result of

nature's destructive capability. This most recent earthquake in Japan is the greatest earthquake in that nation's history and the seventh most powerful earthquake ever recorded in history.



The catastrophic earthquake and tsunami that hit Japan not only was the cause of massive death and destruction, it damaged the atomic energy plants in Japan which resulted in another national emergency but potentially a global problem as well. This natural disaster has been a reminder to us today that we really don't know enough to even predict earthquake activity in order for peoples and nations to prepare for the massive destruction that may result from such an event. The development of the fossil seismograph will assist in planning for future building near these areas prone to earthquakes.

The word "earthquake" is used 19 times in the Bible, 13 times in the prophetic passages of the Word of God. In the Olivet Discourse, the most profound prophetic message ever given, a message preached by Jesus Christ on the Mount of Olives three days before He was crucified, when the Lord said that earthquakes in many different places would be a sign of His Second Coming (Matthew 24:7). In the prophetic book of Revelation, the word "earthquake" is used seven times between Revelation 6-16.

en3 Student Ministry Welcomes New Ministry Associate, Taylor Teel

The newest member of the student ministry team, Taylor Teel, grew up “absolutely everywhere,” having been born into a military family. Consequently, Taylor has lived in Georgia twice, Hawaii, Alabama twice, Florida, North Dakota, and the northern Virginia-Washington, D.C. area. Taylor grew up with 3 siblings—older sister, Katie, and two younger brothers, Zach and Jesse. The Teel family was extremely close. Laughter diffused most disagreements. Since the family moved often, the siblings remained close. That way, they could take their friends with them when they moved.

Taylor’s mother is the glue of that family. With his dad in the Air Force, he had to be gone a lot. Their mother kept everyone intact and on schedule—“Teel Time,” they called it—even if hurrying caused a side-trip to the emergency room.

Taylor’s mother is incredibly gifted. More recently, she has become a great cook. Before that, she was a devoted mother who found time to write an original Fourth of July play, “America Cries Out”—a major production that ran for three evenings at their church. She also

managed four children who were involved in sports and school activities. The things that Taylor admires most about his mother are her efforts to teach Scripture and to encourage her children to excel using their God-given, individually-suited gifts. Katie, Taylor’s sister, is a gifted English teacher; Taylor, a youth minister; one brother, an artist/musician; and the other brother is training in horticulture. Taylor’s dad retired after 23 years in the Air Force as a Lieutenant Colonel. He instilled a work ethic and a proper perspective for every task that Taylor undertakes in life. Despite typical father-son disagreements about grades, Taylor’s father continued to love and to lead him as every father should guide his children.

Taylor’s spiritual upbringing was incredibly rich. The Teel family was actively involved with whichever church they attended—singing, serving, or simply meeting and impacting others. Taylor’s family attended Methodist, Baptist, and Bible churches along the way; however, Taylor knows how crucial it is to focus on Jesus alone. Taylor contends that if one pushes everything else to the side and looks to Jesus, “it’s impossible to go wrong.”

Taylor met his wife, Tam, at the end of their freshman year at Auburn University. They had dated 18 months when Taylor realized that Tam was "the one." She had everything he could hope to find in a wife. Not only was she an Auburn cheerleader (life goal – complete!), but also she possessed the qualities of a godly wife and mother. "Honestly," Taylor confesses, "I couldn't wait to marry her!" And the two married on March 27th, 2004, and have grown more in love since then.

The most significant influence in Taylor's young life is his wife. She demonstrates love in action and is willing to go wherever the Lord calls. Daily, she shows Taylor what it means to have a practical, living faith and a full life of prayer. Tam has a heart for ministry. Her sweet spirit is evident whether she is interacting with toddlers, students, or married women. Tam's heart is especially drawn to students. Taylor believes that God has given Tam a unique ability to attract others to herself with her gentle but fun personality. He also commends her abilities to listen and to encourage and to offer biblical insight.

Taylor and Tam have three sons—Tristan, Tucker, and Tanner. At five, Tristan is an analytical thinker and an excellent helper around the house. Tristan enjoys Legos® and Star Wars® toys, and can hit and throw a ball. At three, Tucker is a "bowling ball of destruction." Tucker's smile charms his way out of most situations; and he possesses an innocent heart. The newest Teel, Tanner, is laid back at ten months of age, and he goes with the flow no matter how fast the current.

The extraordinary life of the biblical character Joseph has always intrigued Taylor. Joseph's path must have been "extremely daunting." Taylor would ask Joseph for a grand tour of Egypt, then share a meal with Joseph, his brothers, and his dad—Jacob: "Having ten brothers

who tried to kill you, only to beg for forgiveness later, would make for interesting dinner conversation."

Five years ago, Taylor and Tam prayed separately about a call to ministry. What Taylor did not know was how, when, and where they would serve. Taylor and Tam continued to serve in their local church. After leading the middle-school students as a volunteer pastor-speaker on Wednesday nights for a year, Taylor noticed how God had formed unique bonds with these young people and used Taylor to impact their future. Because students misunderstand fundamentals of faith, record numbers of students are dropping out of church and rejecting their faith. Taylor wants to take every opportunity to show students the truth through God's Word.

Taylor employs the Third Day song "Born Again" to describe his life. Not only does Taylor know that he's born again, but also he believes that he is in the center of God's will—and truly alive. Taylor describes his passion for Christ using Colossians 1:28-29: "He is the one we proclaim, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ. To this end I strenuously contend with all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me." Taylor considers the idea that we have been justified and that Christ has cancelled completely our debt of sin to be "utterly humbling. . . simply amazing and mind boggling."



Taylor was gracious to give this interview by email to Carol Bailey, wife of John Bailey, and mother to Christa and Cara. The Baileys have been members of FBCA, since 1995 when John came to serve as Minister of Youth and Recreation for First Baptist.

fbca begins **Hispanic Outreach**

"Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world, red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in his sight."

Even though this is an old Sunday school song, it reminds us of a larger picture, the diversity of God's kingdom. The Bible teaches us that a great multitude from every nation, tribe, people and language will be standing before the throne of God (Rev 7:9). As the church, we have a responsibility to reach the nations, starting with our own.

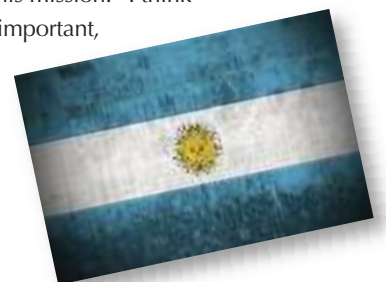
The growth of Hispanics in the United States has surpassed 50 million, becoming the country's largest minority according to the Census Bureau. It is no wonder then that the number of Hispanics in the church has increased as well. The Hispanic community has specific needs, cultural differences and language barriers to overcome. The good news is that the church can offer fellowship and ministry opportunities to help care for and embrace Hispanics within the church and outside of the church.

Gustavo and Vicsely Quintero, a Venezuelan couple that attend First Baptist Church of Alpharetta, started a Spanish-speaking Bible study in their home that began with eight people. Since then, the group has outgrown the Quintero household with over 50 members. They will be moving their meeting location to the church building and become an FBCA Connect Group. Many of the leaders within this group are active church members that serve in other ministries, such as worship and production teams.

When the Quintero's were looking for a church home and they visited FBCA, they fell in love with the service, the worship and the teaching. But what stood out to them most was the importance of family within the church. They were looking for a place their entire family would feel welcome and grow spiritually. They were not disappointed. "I would recommend the children's ministry to everyone," Mrs. Quintero said.

Within the Hispanic community, family togetherness is a priority. Unfortunately, when coming to the U.S. like many other immigrants, Hispanics leave their native country either looking for opportunities to give their family a better future or to send back financial support for the ones they've left behind. This process is not easy to go through alone. That is why having a church family to offer encouragement and companionship is one of the needs the Hispanic community has.

Colombian born, Fernando Landazabal is one of the leaders in the FBCA Hispanic group. He explains that Hispanics can feel very isolated when they are away from their family and their native country. However, FBCA can make a difference. "As Christians, God's love can be shown to them, offering them what they need," Landazabal said. "It is difficult to do this, but we as a team can reach these people." Spending time with people, eating together and celebrating birthday parties has allowed unique opportunities to fellowship and help keep people coming back to church. Instead of staying within the walls of the church, they offer a church family outside of those walls as well. "Americans have all their families here with them, so they have people to spend time with but we don't have all our families here," Mrs. Quintero said. "Our family is the church family," Landazabal added. The support of their church family is not coincidental; FBCA has a clear mission to reach all groups of people for Christ, regardless of language, race or culture. Partnering with the Hispanic members of the church is a starting point to accomplishing this mission. "I think the philosophy of the church is very important, to be a reflection of the community no matter who you are or where you came from," Mr. Quintero said. The leaders of the FBCA Hispanic group can count on the support

of pastors and staff to continue their efforts in ministry. Although there is no formula to reach the Hispanic community, there is an open dialogue with the FBCA Hispanic group to exchange ideas, share resources and help one another. Ministry can be challenging at times, but the church applauds the work and heart of the FBCA Hispanic group.

"Reaching the people in our community is a vital part of our local mission and is imperative to fulfilling our church vision. We are so excited to have the opportunity to support the ministry work by Fernando, Gustavo, Vicsely and their families in reaching the Hispanic community around us. We are even happier to leverage their current ministry to enable expansion to reach the larger Hispanic community in North Fulton and South Forsyth. Our ministry plans are exciting, and we trust God will use this ministry to reflect His glory and love in a way that will transform the lives of those involved," said Jason Phillips, former FBCA Reaching Pastor.

The FBCA pastors and staff are open to new and innovative ways of doing ministry. The Quinteros and Landazabals have shared their ideas with Pastor Phillips on how to communicate effectively the message of the gospel to the Hispanic community. "Having translations of the teaching would really help so they can hear the word of God," Mrs.

Quintero said. They discussed the possibility of also starting a Spanish-speaking Vacation Bible School for children, hosting prayer activities in Spanish, as well as translating the FBCA website. "God is using the church to do whatever they can to reach the Hispanic community in a very sincere way," Mrs. Quintero said.

Hispanics are one of the ethnic groups that are growing in FBCA. The FBCA Hispanic group might be paving the way for other ethnic groups in the future. More ethnic groups, mean more cultures, languages and ministry opportunities to help spread the word of God. It might also mean new challenges to overcome, but it will be worth it to see what God has in store for FBCA. Not only are the Quinteros and Landazabals passionate about reaching their Hispanic community, they are also passionate about reaching all people and serving in the church. "I'm very excited to see God's hand working," Mr. Quintero said. "Whatever the church needs, we'll be there."

Bible prophecy says that future earthquakes will be so bad that men will hide in fear and even call for the mountains and rocks to fall upon them to hide them from the wrath of God (Revelation 6:12-16). This passage speaks of the great earthquake at the beginning of the seven year Tribulation period with additional prophecies about earthquakes in Revelation 8:5 and 11:13-19. Earthquakes continue throughout the seven years of judgment and culminate with the greatest earthquake to ever hit the earth.

The great earthquake in Revelation 6:12 is the Sixth Seal Judgment happening in the first half of the seven year Tribulation period. Near the midway point of the Tribulation, there will be a number of earthquakes that cause great damage and death and they are foretold in Revelation 8:5 and 11:13-19. The greatest earthquake to ever hit the earth will happen at the end of the Tribulation period. It will destroy the modern day nation of Iraq which is Biblical Babylon, the headquarters for the worldwide economic, political and governmental activities of the Antichrist (Revelation 16:17-21).

The horrible earthquake and resulting tsunami that took the lives of thousands in Japan, and displaced tens of thousands more is a grim reminder of just how not-in-control we are.

Japan is one of the richest, most technologically advanced nations on the planet, and yet none of their technology or wealth was able to protect them from the power of nature. In fact, some of the greatest fear has been as a result of the problems with the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant, its many gas and radiation leaks, explosions, and the possibility of a meltdown. It is technology itself that is causing the widest-spread concern.

However a "return to nature" approach wouldn't protect us, either. A less-reported quake the day before the 9.0 occurred on the border of China and Burma - an area far less wealthy, less populated, and less technological than most of Japan, and though the quake was far less powerful, merely a 5.4 on the Richter scale, dozens were killed, and thousands displaced. We cannot predict, much less control

the future - but God can, does, and has. We must not place our confidence in ourselves, our wealth, our technology... But in our God, and Him alone.

Despite our attempts to forecast earthquakes, God alone knows the future. He alone is able to stop them. The power of the earthquakes should not cause us to fear the ground beneath our feet - but the God who created and controls the entire Earth. He knows the future because He controls the future. And He will call His Church away before the terrible time of judgment unfolds on this Earth.

The Rapture of the Church is the next event on God's prophetic timetable of events. There are no prophecies that must take place before that happens. And we see evidence that the Return of Christ is near. Jesus Christ will return to the Earth, and when He steps foot on the Mount of Olives in Israel, another great earthquake will occur changing the topography of that region. But that happens at the end of the Tribulation period. The Rapture of the Church must occur seven years before that. Seeing how close the Return of Christ is, we know the Rapture is even closer. It could happen at any moment - even today. And having said that, there is nothing left for me to say, except let's keep looking up...Until then, Jimmy DeYoung.

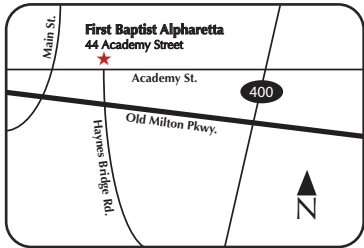
